

The steel framed structure was clad with standing seam roofing and a mixture of clay and aluminium wall cladding.

External works comprised reinforced concrete, tarmac and block paved areas.

The building also incorporates a suite of community facilities, including three meeting/activity rooms and a faith room, all with dedicated welfare facilities.



GNA were appointed as Quantity Surveyors for the construction of the first major fire station in 20 years for Nottinghamshire.

The overall floor area of 3000m² consisted of a double height garage facility for fire fighting vehicles together with attached offices, welfare and ancillary facilities on two floors.



The station is one of the largest in the region and is now home to many specialist vehicles and resources including the Specialist Rescue team and their associated vehicles.

The unit can accommodate 48 full-time fire fighters and its appliance bays currently house 3 fire engines and a modified 4x4 and boat.
